

Thank you to all those families that took part in our recent behaviour survey. It is really important that we hear your views as well as get an understanding of the needs of our children and families.

Below are some of the headlines and statistics from the survey. As a school we have taken those comments and discussed what we will do moving forward and shared what we already do.

In total we had responses from 87 families:







Feedback from incidents or disagreements. I know confidentiality needs to be maintained but most of the time I feel like I have to chase for feedback or the outcome.

Try to get in touch about incidents that we feel have occurred. Sometimes we might not be aware of the incident and so do encourage children to speak about issues at school before going home. Some incidents may naturally need more investigation, so we are grateful for your patience when this happens.

You said:

We need to share that:

I think the behaviour policy in place is complex and difficult to understand.

We have a simpler version called 'Behaviour on a Page'.

This has been on our policy and available as a print out at the last two parent's evenings.

Our policy does have step by step tables and charts to

we can.

Behaviour should have some sort of record that parents can view each day to see how well they have done at school. Or even a weekly report would be handy.



We use report cards and targets for pupils who are currently having their behaviour monitored or it's being worked on with the teacher.

Our Class Dojo points are shared at parent meetings and can be viewed with the teacher at any time on request.

We will discuss any further changes that we may make to sharing our behaviour system and dojo points.

We have read each and every comment and will take them all into consideration when moving forward.

We had comments about improving communication and this will be shared with staff and our office.

We also had some very kinds comments shared about classes and staff members, and those have also been shared with them.

What's Next?

Our aim now is to begin using the Stories feature on Class Dojo. This is a simple way for classes to share the great things they are doing within school. It works just like a social media app, with posts and pictures that can be viewed by just classes or the whole school.

Once we have decided on a policy and how best to use this, we will open it out to parents to connect with. We will keep the features limited to begin with and will add further features when we feel the time is right.

As before, any feedback on the process will be appreciated, and we'll be collecting feedback in the first few weeks of launching.
